THE FOLLOWING ARE EXAMPLES OF PROGRESS MADE DURING FY18 RELATED TO THE HEALTH **NEEDS IDENTIFIED IN THE 2016 CHNA.**

Youth Mental Health First Aid Trainings

Fiscal year 2018 represented the final year of the three-year Southwestern Indiana Project AWARE grant. During the life of the grant, the group's representatives

- Conducted 53 First Aider courses representing 448 hours of instruction
- Trained 922 adults as "First Aiders" and another 16 adults as instructors
- Made 1,880 youth referrals to mental health resources in the community

Working Together to Address Substance Use Disorders

To address the high number of drug-related health issues and deaths, Deaconess actively participates in the Mayor's Substance Abuse Task Force and the Vanderburgh County Health Department's Opioid Fatality Review Committee. Both groups provide the opportunity to identify and investigate all aspects of drug addiction in our community. Additionally, The Women's Hospital partnered with Southwestern Behavioral Healthcare's Stepping Forward Transitional Residential Program to help pregnant women address and treat substance use disorders.

Cancer

Deaconess physicians from ENT, dermatology, and oncology provided free cancer screenings in FY18 with the following results:

- Low-dose CT scan for lung cancer: 7 newly-diagnosed lung cancers and 31 abnormal screenings requiring additional follow-up (imaging, tissue sampling, etc.)
- Skin cancer screening: 62 normal screenings with 22 patients recommended for follow-up with a dermatologist
- Head and neck cancer screening: 44 normal exams with 25 patients recommended for follow-up with a primary care physician or ENT

We provided 2,628 on-site mammograms using our Mobile Breast Center. Deaconess cancer experts also created blogs, social media videos, and community presentations to educate the public on prevention, early detection, and treatment for a variety of cancers.
