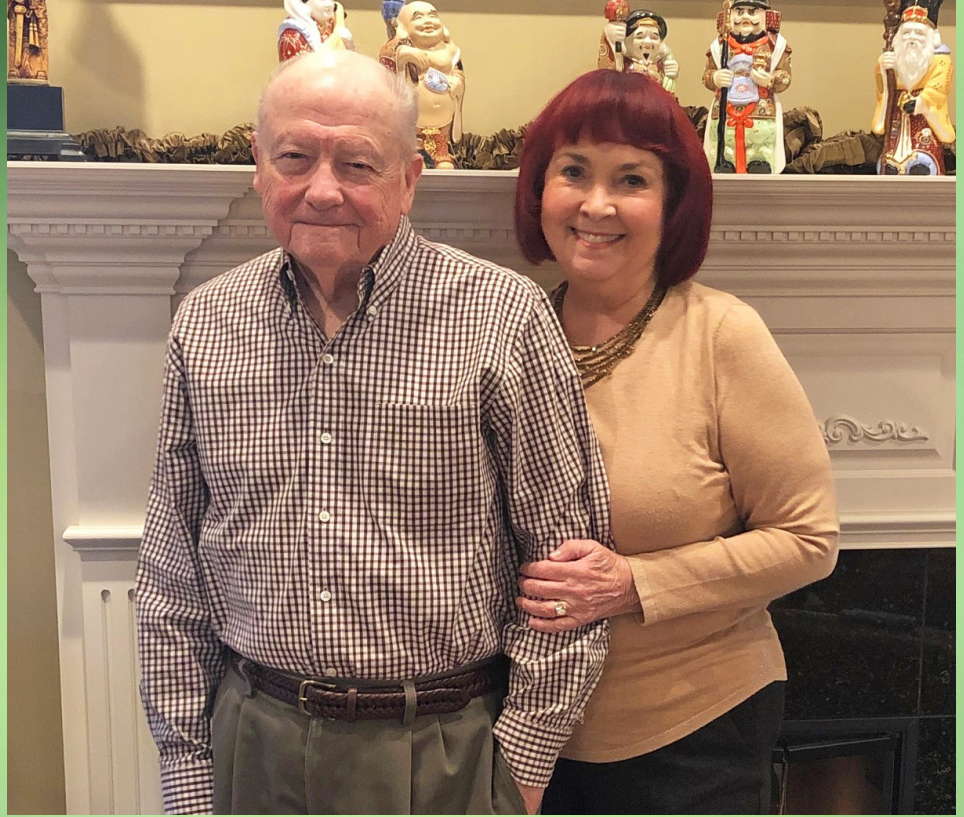

Building a legacy of generosity



Health care has been a lifelong passion for both Dr. Jerry and Shirley Becker. Dr. Becker came to Evansville with a group of internists in the late 1960s. His true passion was cardiology. He helped create a group of physicians focused on the specialty of heart care in the region. At that time there were no stress tests, bypass procedures, or heart catheterizations in our area. Dr. Becker brought cardiology research to the hospital and Shirley opened that facility, training the nurses on Federal Regulations and research process. He, with colleagues, also brought Cardiac Rehab to our region and Shirley opened that unit as head nurse. Cardiac Rehab continues to be a vital part of cardiac care at Deaconess.

“Change is always difficult, but necessary,” said Dr. Becker. “You have to keep improving, especially in health care.”

Shirley has had an equally impactful career. She was charge nurse in Cardiac Intensive Care at Deaconess. “Back then there weren’t even medications for things like hypertension,” said Shirley. She worked for Bristol Myers Squibb as Coordinator of Cardiac Clinical Research. Shirley also helped to teach federal regulations and went on to create her own company, Clinical Research Consulting, Inc. “Research provides answers

to difficult questions,” Shirley noted when explaining her passion for medical research.

The Beckers turned their health knowledge to a new area when their daughter married a man whose family was impacted by pulmonary fibrosis. Pulmonary fibrosis is a condition in which scarring of lung tissue makes breathing difficult and reduces oxygen flow to the blood stream. So little was known about the disease, it was not even recognized by the National Institutes of Health (NIH). They knew something had to be done. “Shirley has always had a passion for the outliers,” Dr. Becker said of his wife who set to work organizing a meeting of the minds, including 10 pulmonologists from across the nation. They gathered and discussed the illness, forming many action steps including a plan to create a pulmonary fibrosis registry. After submitting their registry, the NIH recognized the disease. Shirley helped found the national organization of Coalition of Pulmonary Fibrosis (now Pulmonary Fibrosis Foundation) and founded our regional organization of Pulmonary

Fibrosis Partners (PFP) which has operated as an educational organization for more than a decade.

Recently Deaconess Foundation assumed future management of PFP. PFP was able to provide over \$25,000 to the Foundation for continued pulmonary educational programs. While there is still no cure, research has led to the development of treatments and genetic testing for pulmonary fibrosis.

Dr. and Mrs. Becker have supported many health initiatives, most recently helping to fund the purchase of a CuddleCot® for The Women’s Hospital Bereavement program. (To learn more about the CuddleCot® gifts see the article on page 4.) The Beckers have also supported projects such as the Linda E. White Hospice House, the Deaconess Classic for Women’s Health, Deaconess Party of the Year, HeartSaver and many others. Shirley explained she believes God gives everyone puzzle pieces. We fit together what gifts we have with

the gifts and skills of those around us to solve problems and help others.

“Jerry and Shirley have touched numerous individuals throughout their Deaconess years,” said Linda White, Deaconess Foundation Executive Director. “Jerry’s patients remember him with admiration for his kindness and medical knowledge. Shirley is well respected for her abilities to move projects from concept to meaningful outcomes. Their support of Deaconess and Deaconess Foundation resonates in all directions.”

When asked why giving is important, Shirley responded, “It’s just asking them and giving the opportunity to raise a hand.” Dr. Becker added, “It’s important to have an interest. Ours is health care. Everyone has something that’s important to them.”

Dr. and Mrs. Becker reside in Newburgh, Indiana, where they enjoy being involved with community projects, their church, and spending time with their six children and eight grandchildren.

CuddleCot Project

Sharing loss to bring healing.

CuddleCot®. This is not a piece of hospital equipment most people are familiar with, and those who hope they never have a need to use it. A CuddleCot® is a bassinet-like device with an attached coolant system. It is used in situations where an infant is stillborn or passes away soon after birth. The CuddleCot® keeps a deceased infant's body cool and preserved for hours, allowing the baby to be kept in a private room with family without the risk of deterioration. The device provides the gift of time for families as they grieve.

The need for a CuddleCot® was first brought to The Women's Hospital's attention by the Konrath family. Erin and Daniel gave birth to beautiful twins boys. While Elliot was strong and healthy, Adler did not survive. The Konraths heard about the cots and reached out to Deaconess Foundation to see if one could be added to The Women's Hospital. A second family, Bryee and Colt

Guisewhite and Bryee's mother Chya Colbert, came forward to help fundraise for a cot after Bryee and Colt lost their child and heard about the project.

Both families worked with Deaconess Foundation to boldly share their stories, generating thousands of dollars toward the purchase of two CuddleCot® units. The Becker family (see story on page 2) was so moved by the personal experiences of the families that they made a gift to cover the remaining funds needed.

With two CuddleCot® systems now available, The Women's Hospital, as well as other Deaconess facilities, will have access to this bereavement resource to aid families in the healing process.

Since the dedication, the Guisewhites have welcomed a new baby boy into their family, and the Konraths are awaiting the birth of their new baby. We wish both families much happiness and thank them for their efforts and generosity to make this resource available for families experiencing loss.

From big projects to small needs, each gift makes an impact.

Deaconess Cancer Services purchased "Cooking for Chemo" books through a Foundation grant. The cookbooks educate cancer patients and families on cooking in ways that are healthy and sensitive to chemo treatments.

Deaconess Clinic Nephrology purchased blood pressure cuffs for at-risk patients with a Foundation grant. Due to recent health care changes, home blood pressure monitors are no longer paid for and many patients with fixed or minimal incomes cannot afford them. The blood pressure cuffs allow patients to monitor their health at home, an essential part of hypertension management. A change in blood pressure can alert a patient to contact their physician before something more serious occurs.

Deaconess Cross Pointe, provides both inpatient and outpatient mental health services to the Tri-State. At times, there are patients who do not have basic provisions or their family is too far away to provide clothing. Cross Pointe offers a clothing bank, funded by Deaconess Foundation, so that these individuals can have proper clothing. The items are free of charge to the patients in need.

HeartSaver Recognized

Saving lives through AEDs.

When HeartSaver, a collaboration of Deaconess Foundation and The Heart Hospital at Deaconess Gateway, was formed in 2014, the new committee was passionate about raising funds to place automated external defibrillators (AEDs) in area schools, churches, community centers, non-profit organizations and first responder vehicles. With the first donation of \$25 in October 2014, the HeartSaver committee was off and running!

Fast forward a little more than four years later, and HeartSaver has raised more than \$400,000 and placed 300 AEDs throughout the Tri-State area. Donations from individuals and businesses, along with numerous grants, have allowed HeartSaver to save lives. Last fall at the West Side Nut Club Fall Festival, an Indiana State Police trooper used an AED that had been provided by HeartSaver to save a life. Other area residents have a second chance at life thanks to an AED placed by HeartSaver.

HeartSaver was recognized by Indiana Governor Eric Holcomb at the Indiana State House for helping to place AEDs in all Indiana State Police vehicles. Representing Deaconess at the event with Governor Holcomb were HeartSaver committee members Penny Goshert, Becky Malotte, and Mark Moore and Linda White, Executive Director of Deaconess Foundation.

HeartSaver also granted 10 AEDs to the Evansville Police Department Foundation (EPD) so these AEDs could be placed in EPD vehicles. While proud to place the 10 AEDs, only 10% of EPD vehicles have an AED. HeartSaver still has work to do.

Sudden cardiac arrest does not discriminate. It can strike at any age. First responders are often on the scene before an ambulance arrives. Having lifesaving medical equipment like AEDs in first responder vehicles can truly mean the difference between life and death. An AED could save the life of a loved one, a neighbor or you.

Women helping women!

25 Years Impacting Women's Health

Like many Deaconess Foundation projects, the Deaconess Classic began as a passion for a cause. A group of community women had the idea of creating a golf event for women to support awareness and treatment of women's cancers. When the first Deaconess Classic was held in 1995, there were many skeptics in the community who thought the event would be a failure. An all-women's golf event was so far-fetched at the time, many said no one would attend. The Classic committee was told they would never find 124 women golfers at such a costly entry fee.

Year one, the Deaconess Classic sold out...

Year two, another sold out event...

Every Deaconess Classic since has sold out.

Each year, an all-volunteer committee of community women works with Deaconess Foundation to bring the event to life. Holley Brundick, the first Deaconess Classic chair, said, "We always put a lot of thought into each tournament and have wonderful prizes. I think everyone looks forward to the Deaconess Classic."

More than \$2.5 million has been raised since the first Deaconess Classic. More importantly, more than 12,000 mammograms and pelvic ultrasounds have been provided to women who otherwise would not be able to afford these critical health care procedures. A 53 year old woman who discovered a lump in her breast, but was scared of the cost of a screening. A 68 year old woman living in a rural area who couldn't afford

to travel to Evansville for a mammogram. A 59 year old woman who never had a mammogram because she couldn't afford one. The generosity of so many Classic supporters continues to save the lives of people they have never met.



Classic funds raised help cover mammogram screenings for women in need not only at Deaconess Breast Center locations, but also on our Deaconess Mobile Breast Center, a coach equipped with 3D mammography technology (pictured above). The coach travels throughout the Tri-State providing mammograms to women who may not have the opportunity due to location, schedule, or socioeconomic status. The Breast Center staff often share the story of two women in rural Daviess County, Indiana. They were in their 50s and never had a mammogram. The women pulled up to the Mobile Breast Center in a horse-drawn buggy. Because of our mobile mammography program, which has benefited from Deaconess Classic proceeds, the women received their mammograms. When the first Deaconess Classic took place in 1995, there was no way to anticipate that one day there would be a 40-foot coach traveling throughout the region providing mammograms to women in need. What the first Deaconess Classic committee and subsequent committees realized is that there would always be women in need of critical health care procedures. The Classic continues to raise funds that impact hundreds of women every year.

Regional Affiliations. Local Care.

Deaconess and Methodist to provide continued local care.

Deaconess Health System and Methodist Hospital have finalized the agreement forming an affiliation focusing on enhancing local health care in western Kentucky. Methodist Hospital represents two hospitals, one in Henderson, Kentucky and one in Morganfield, Kentucky (a critical access hospital with 25 beds). Methodist Hospital also includes physician practices, outpatient services and other health related services.

Deaconess has a 33.3% ownership in Methodist. Working together will bring clinical expertise and alignment that will enable Methodist to expand local services. Epic, the nation's most widely-used electronic medical record providing patients with one health record, will be implemented this summer. Methodist Hospital Union County will receive a much needed upgrade to its Emergency Department with an investment made by Deaconess. Vacant space in Methodist Hospital's Henderson location will soon be rented to Deaconess for the location of Deaconess Clinic physician offices.

Both Deaconess and Methodist look forward to this new affiliation to improve the health of the people in western Kentucky and keep patient care local.
