

Transfer of the Trauma Patient To Deaconess Midtown

Purpose: To ensure rapid transfer of injured patients in a regional trauma system

Goals: Transfers from Deaconess Midtown Hospital shall be in accordance with the Deaconess transfer policy. The following guidelines are recommended for patients who have sustained a traumatic injury and need to be transferred to Deaconess Midtown Hospital

Guidelines:

- A. Responsibilities of the transferring physician
 - a. To resuscitate the patient within resources available
 - b. To assess the urgency of transfer
 - c. To decide on the mode of transportation
 - d. To decide on the level of care necessary to best manage the patient's injuries
 - e. To consider the potential problems which may develop during transport
 - f. To communicate with the Call Center regarding potential trauma transfer
 - g. To provide a copy of records, laboratory and radiologic studies
 - h. To complete and send transfer forms with the patient
 - i. This includes the pre-hospital patient care report
- B. Responsibilities of the receiving physician
 - a. To communicate directly with the transferring physician
 - b. To suggest additional maneuvers to enhance the care of the patient during transport
 - c. To assist the transferring physician in deciding the mode of transportation and type of personnel necessary for safe transfer
 - d. To obtain the name and phone number of the transferring physician, patient name, and information pertinent to continuity of care
