

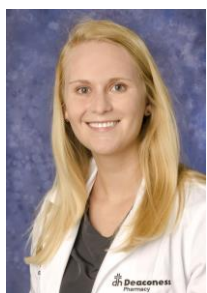

Christina Ancelet, PharmD

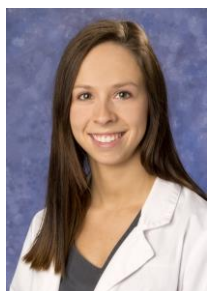
