Dr. Phillip Adams, MD—Making an Impact at Deaconess Foundation

For Deaconess Hospitalist Dr. Adams, giving back to Deaconess Foundation is not a question. He first became involved with the Deaconess Foundation after presenting a grant request, which led to his invitation to join the Foundation Board. “I had always thought the Foundation Board sounded like a great opportunity to give back to Deaconess,” he shared. For him, giving isn’t just about financial support—it’s about making a meaningful impact on both patients and staff.

Since then, he has enjoyed being part of the Foundation’s mission to advance the compassionate and caring spirit of Deaconess Health. For him, the purpose of giving extends beyond just financial support; “My wife and I hope to make a positive impact on Deaconess patients,” he said, noting their long-standing support for cancer care,

driven by personal experience and loss. Deaconess Foundation stands out through its unwavering commitment to ensuring donations stay within the organization. “All of the money donated stays with patients and employees here at Deaconess,” he said. This transparency and focus on direct impact is what drew him into the Foundation and what keeps him motivated.

As Chair of the Grants Committee, Dr. Adams enjoys funding creative ideas that improve patient care. “We love funding the ‘wants’ rather than just the needs,” he shared. He also serves as a liaison

for the Deaconess Case Management Department, the voice for the front-line staff. His deep involvement with staff and ongoing efforts to understand their needs reflect his belief in the importance of supporting all aspects of the health system's operations.

Through his time with Deaconess Foundation, Dr. Adams has been involved in several impactful projects. One he and his wife are particularly passionate about is the HeartSaver program, which funds AEDs that have already saved eight lives in the community. He's also proud of initiatives like the transcranial magnetic stimulation machine which provides a new service for patients with depression, as well as the Deaconess bears, which bring comfort to children undergoing surgery. Dr. Adams stated, "If you asked my daughter, she'd say the Deaconess bears are her favorite!"

When he's not working with the Deaconess Foundation, Dr. Adams is busy with his family. "Our lives revolve around our children, and we love it that way!" he shared. With five kids involved in extracurricular activities, there's never a dull moment. He and his wife also share a passion for travel, one that they have passed down to their children.

Deaconess Pediatric Department: Calming Projector to Transform Exam Rooms

For many children, a trip to the doctor can be scary. The unfamiliar sights, sounds, and procedures can make even the bravest little ones nervous. Thanks to the kindness and generosity of donors to Deaconess Foundation, moments of fear are being replaced with comfort, calm, and even smiles.

Through donor support Deaconess Foundation was able to purchase a special projector to be used during pediatric echocardiograms. This small but mighty piece of equipment turns a cold exam room into a world of gentle lights, music, and wonder, by projecting onto the ceiling of an exam room. Now, instead of staring at machines, children can gaze at soothing images—while their hearts are being carefully examined.

“Having distractions for ‘scary’ experiences in a pediatric doctor’s office can change the



child’s perception from scary to a feeling of success. That positive experience can be built on for all future visits in the same office and with other providers. “Setting kids up for success is key,” shared Jodie Kissel, a licensed clinical social worker at Deaconess Riley Children’s Specialty Center.

What was once an anxious, tearful moment for a child has become one filled with curiosity and calm—all because of your generosity.

Deaconess Henderson Hospital Emergency Department: New SANE Technology Implemented

For the nurses on the front lines of sexual assault care, every detail matters. The evidence they gather can be life-changing, not only for the medical treatment of their patients but also for seeking justice.

Jaci Nall, a Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner (SANE) at Deaconess Henderson Hospital ER, shared the profound impact of the iPhone they received, though donor support, for evidence documentation in sexual assault cases.

“During the training course we had to take in order to become a SANE, the topic of the importance of having photo documentation within the patient chart to be used in court was heavily emphasized. Being able to take high-quality photos of the injuries these patients have will help paint a vivid story for the jury, who may not have a medical background.”

In the delicate work of sexual assault examinations, every photograph, every piece of evidence is critical. With the iPhone grant from Deaconess Foundation donors, SANE nurses now have the ability to capture these images directly into the Epic system, ensuring seamless documentation and a more efficient process for law enforcement and legal teams.

“This is yet another step that we are taking in order to make sure such a vulnerable population receives the best possible advocacy and care they can,” Jaci explained.

Thanks to the generosity of our donors, Deaconess SANE nurses are equipped to continue their critical work, advocating for justice and providing the highest level of care to those who need it most.

Deaconess Gibson Hospital Emergency Department: Enhancing Patient Outcomes with LUCAS CPR Device

Designed to reduce caregiver fatigue and enhance patient outcomes, the Lund University Cardiopulmonary Assistant System (LUCAS) is an automated CPR device that delivers lifesaving treatment in emergency situations. The LUCAS device delivers

compressions at a consistent depth and rate—crucial for blood flow to the brain and other organs during resuscitation efforts.

Lyndsi Dunn, Chief Nursing Officer, explained, “the Lucas device has made a profound difference in our Emergency Department. It allows us to deliver consistent, high-quality CPR during critical moments, giving our patients the best possible chance at survival when every second counts.”

Planned Giving:

The Cornerstone Society is comprised of individuals who want a legacy of giving with their planned gift to Deaconess Foundation through wills, bequests, life insurance policies or other methods of planned giving. For more information, please call 812-450-3359.

Bequests:

A bequest is a written statement in a person's will directing that specific assets, a specific amount, or a percentage of the estate, will be transferred to a specific charity upon the donor's death.

Retirement Plans and IRAs:

For many individuals, retirement plan assets represent the single largest asset in their portfolios. Like the bequest, naming an organization as the beneficiary of a retirement plan or IRA is easy to understand and easy to implement. Additionally, individuals who are 70½ or older can direct their Required Minimum Distributions (RMDs) from their IRA directly to a qualified charity without incurring income tax on the distribution. This strategy, known as a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD), allows donors to support while also reducing their taxable income, making it an attractive option for those looking to maximize the impact of their charitable giving.

Life Insurance:

Donors may gift an existing policy, either fully paid or partially paid, or a new policy. Similar to a retirement plan designation, the proposed gift to charity is accomplished by naming the charity as a beneficiary of the policy on the beneficiary designation form.
